What it means to be a student on a Higher Education Licensed Programme of the University of Bath at Bath College

- Your **teaching** will take place at **Bath College**.
- Applications for FdSc Applied Computing are made through UCAS and processed by Bath College and your fees are payable to them. Further information is available from the College. The BSc (Hons) Applied Computing programme is only available to students who complete the Foundation Degree with an overall average of 55% or over.

- The University of Bath undertakes to make every reasonable effort to ensure the University handbook is accurate for your programme of study. The College will make every reasonable effort to ensure the College programme handbook is accurate and reflects the delivery of your programme. In the case of any minor changes to a course or programme these will be brought to your attention at the start of the programme. There may be rare occasions where due to unforeseen or unavoidable circumstances (e.g. a key member of staff leaves the College or low recruitment to a programme means it is no longer viable) it becomes necessary to make significant changes to a programme or to withdraw it completely between the offer of admission and registration. This may include the availability of optional units on the programme. In this unlikely event the College will notify you as soon as possible and will either offer you another programme for which you are appropriately qualified or negotiate on your behalf for another UCAS choice.
