Course Type: Part Time Qualifications

Duration: 36 weeks

This Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training has been designed to take a practical approach to the application of the knowledge necessary to become a successful teacher in the Life-Long Learning sector. The course runs on a Friday afternoon for two years.

A minimum of 100 hours teaching over the 2 years is required. This teaching must be in a 'full' teacher role involving planning, teaching and assessing a variety of learners across more than one level. Voluntary placement can be provided where a subject specialism matches the College's provision.

What are the entry requirements?

What qualifications will I gain?

The Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training is the replacement of the DTLLS qualification. The Diploma has been designed to take a practical approach to the application of the knowledge necessary to become a successful teacher in the Life Long Learning sector.

How will I learn?

The students learn through discussion, video clips, group work, case studies and through practical tasks within placement.

How will I be assessed?

The assessment is through ongoing assignments and workplace observations.

Are there any additional costs?
