

Careers and Curriculum Information Advice and Guidance Offer 2022-2023

Context Statement

The Careers Team at Bath College provides an all-encompassing, needs-led CEIAG service to college students and their influencers, that collaboratively works with external partners and the College's own curriculum areas to ensure a complete package of careers support is available throughout the student journey. The work of the department is now embedded collegiately across a number of centralised initiatives, including:

- Collegiate Tutorial and Themed Events Calendar
- Service Offer and Curriculum Service Level Agreements
- Destinations

The department has created an IAG offer for level 1, level 2 and level 3 students that provides information, advice and guidance to help them to identify their progression pathways during and after their time at Bath College. These tutorials are complemented by a variety of activities and events that further enhance the IAG offer. This is a programme made up of mandatory and optional aspects for the abovementioned students, with some activities/tutorials also being accessible for level 1 students. 1:1 Support

All tutorials that form part of the above IAG offer are all supported with lesson plans and appropriate resources which are reviewed and updated annually. Students are supported, in addition to the IAG offer, with the opportunity to access 1:1 IAG interviews with a qualified Careers Adviser. 1:1 interviews are arranged with students or via a tutor referral at the convenience of the student and available during term-time these can either be face to face or on Teams. Students can also access careers drop-ins which are also offered online and face to face.

What are the Gatsby Benchmarks?

The Gatsby Benchmarks were developed on behalf of the Gatsby Foundation by Sir John Holman. They define what world class careers provision in education looks like and provide a clear framework for organising the careers provision at your school or college.

The eight Gatsby benchmarks of Good Career Guidance are:

- 1. A stable careers programme
- 2. Learning from career and labour market information
- 3. Addressing the needs of each pupil
- 4. Linking curriculum learning to careers
- 5. Encounters with employers and employees
- 6. Experiences of workplaces
- 7. Encounters with further and higher education
- 8. Personal guidance
